Aged Care and Disability Services

For nearly 50 years, Riverwood Community Centre has been a steadfast source of support for our community.

Our Aged Care Services, integrated within the Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP), empower older individuals to maintain their independence and continue living at home. We offer a range of services, including social support groups, domestic assistance, personalized care, transport, and home maintenance.

As the demand for culturally sensitive services grows in our diverse community, we have expanded to meet these needs.

Our Social Support Groups combat social isolation, with attendance increasing by 218% over the past year due to family encouragement. We believe social engagement is crucial for the cognitive and emotional well-being of our elderly clients.

In response to pandemic-related isolation, we introduced welfare checks and saw a 218% rise in transport service use, as clients hesitated to use public transport.

Our new Home Maintenance service has exceeded expectations, providing essential garden care to boost our clients' well-being.



With the upcoming Aged Care Reform in July 2025, we have implemented policies to enhance transparency, accountability, and service quality.

Our staff has undergone comprehensive training by the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission to ensure they are prepared for these changes.



Investments in technology, such as monitoring systems and data collection, further improve our processes and elevate care standards.

Riverwood Community Centre remains committed to continuous improvement and growth, ensuring our elderly clients receive the highest quality of support in their later years.

Our ongoing enhancements reflect our dedication to serving the evolving needs of our community.

NDIS

Our role is to empower individuals to achieve their personal goals and make the most of their NDIS plans.

From the initial assessment

phase to ongoing support, we focus on fostering independence and enhancing participants' self-management skills. By building strong, supportive networks, we work collaboratively to navigate the complexities of the NDIS, ensuring that each participant's unique needs are met.

Riverwood Community Long Day Care

Riverwood Community Long Day Care proudly achieved a “Meeting National Quality Standards” rating, reflecting continuous improvements across all seven quality areas led by our dedicated educator team.

Children are thriving under the guidance of our Early Childhood Teacher and Educational Leader, who implement a tailored planning cycle to meet the needs of babies, toddlers, and preschoolers.

We partnered with KU Inclusion Support Professionals to enhance support for children with additional needs, securing a \$10,000 Innovative Solutions

Grant for a Child Psychologist to assist in educational practices and developmental strategies. Families were encouraged to seek assessments for suspected developmental delays, and inclusion support strategies were explored to increase educator capacity.

Toddlers and preschoolers enjoy regular Riverwood Library Storytime visits, enriching their language development. During Book Week, children and educators celebrated with themed costumes and shared favourite storybooks. Older children preparing for school participate in readiness programs to develop essential skills for transitioning to a school environment.

To ensure consistency and educator wellbeing, we

expanded our casual educator pool, reducing overtime and allowing regular breaks. A new Educational Leader/Nominated Supervisor role was also created to support service management.

Health initiatives included on-site dental and vision checks to catch issues early, educating children and parents on oral hygiene and vision health. Community engagement featured visits from Police and Fire Brigade officers, where children learned safety tips and explored emergency vehicles.

Family appreciation events, such as BBQs and afternoon teas, celebrated the partnership with parents, with some families sharing cultural dishes.



School Age Education and Care

The Riverwood Community OSHC & Vacation Care team, in collaboration with the Early Childhood team, successfully achieved a "Meeting National Quality Standards" rating.

This milestone was the result of thoughtful reflection, careful observation, comprehensive planning, and incorporating valuable feedback from families and stakeholders. Continuous improvement goals were established, driving progress across all seven quality areas, led by our dedicated team of OSHC educators.

A significant update was made to our Transport Policy in response to changes in the Education and Care Services National Regulations. This update includes a comprehensive Risk Management Plan, a transport supervision checklist, and the assignment of staff educators to ensure the safety and wellbeing of children being transported to and from six local schools during the school term, as well as to and from Vacation Care excursions during school holidays.

Leadership within the OSHC team was further enhanced with the creation of a new OSHC Coordinator/ Nominated Supervisor role.



This position oversees the day-to-day management of before-school, after-school, and vacation care, ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all children at all times.

Riverwood Community OSHC is proud to foster community trust and a reputation for inclusiveness. Several children with diagnosed and undiagnosed special needs are supported through our service. Our partnership with KU Inclusion Support Services has been instrumental in improving outcomes for children with additional needs.

This collaboration provides practical support to our educators, who work closely with families, schools, the Department of Communities and Justice, and other referral support services.

Youth Support

Social participation at Riverwood Community Centre is at the heart of our youth services, which include the Youth Drop-in Service and Youth Holiday Programs.

These initiatives provide young people with a safe and supportive environment where they can connect, learn, and grow.

The Youth Drop-in Service, held weekly on Wednesdays and Thursdays, is more than just a place to hang out—it's a space where our youth can form meaningful friendships, build confidence, and experience a strong sense of belonging.

By fostering trust and connection, we aim to create a welcoming environment that empowers young people to feel supported within their community.

In addition to the Drop-in Service, our Youth Holiday Programs offer enriching and engaging experiences during school breaks.

These programs encourage creativity and personal growth, giving participants the opportunity to explore new interests and develop skills in a fun and relaxed setting.

Whether through arts, sports, or team-building activities, the Holiday Programs provide a much-needed outlet for self-expression and development during times when school is out of session.

Our centre also hosts a popular Basketball Tournament, as well as an employment program in collaboration with other local organizations.

These programs aim to enhance social engagement and provide young people with opportunities to develop important life skills.

The Basketball Tournament promotes teamwork, discipline, and healthy competition, while the employment program helps youth build essential work-readiness skills, preparing them for future career opportunities.



With participation numbers reaching up to 78 clients in one session, the growing demand for these initiatives highlights their importance in the lives of our young community members.

Through these programs, we aim to be a lifeline for our youth, helping them build confidence, lasting friendships, and a strong sense of belonging.

Harmony Day
